At the conclusion of the event, participants were honored with certificates of appreciation and symbolic shields in recognition of their contributions to the success of this academic gathering. Prior to the start of the activity, Professor Dr. Ismail Abdulwahab, Assistant President of Alnoor University for Scientific Affairs, received the delegation of the Iraqi Center for Documentation of Extremism Crimes in his office, where they discussed prospects for joint academic cooperation and ways to strengthen scholarly efforts in promoting the values of diversity and coexistence.
