### 4 QUALITY EDUCATION



Access to education can enhance quality of life and prepare future leaders who will find solutions to global challenges. 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Alnoor Center for Cultural Heritage Preservation at Alnoor University continues its efforts to document Iraq's civilizational memory and safeguard the cultural heritage of Mosul. In this context, the center organized a specialized scientific workshop titled "*The University of Mosul Excavations at the Palace and Library of King Ashurbanipal*." The workshop was presented by Dr. Nabeel Nour Al-Din Hussein, Director of Alnoor Center, in collaboration with the College of Archaeology at the University of Mosul, and held in Dr. Behnam Abu Al-Soof Hall. The event was attended by a distinguished group including Prof. Dr. Wael Al-Nahhas, Dean of the College of Arts at Alnoor University; Prof. Dr. Ahmed Qasim Al-Jum'a, Head of the Archaeological Tourism Department; Dr. Mohammed Zuheir, Director of Cultural Relations; along with several researchers, faculty members, and postgraduate students. The discussions were rich with ideas and insights on ways to apply scientific documentation and modern digital technologies in studying Iraqi archaeological sites. Dr. Nabeel Nour Al-Din delivered a comprehensive presentation on the four excavation seasons conducted by the University of Mosul at the Palace and Library of King Ashurbanipal, emphasizing that these research efforts represent a vital stage in reviving the ancient features of Nineveh. He also analyzed the modern methodologies adopted by Alnoor Center for archiving and analyzing archaeological data as part of its project to digitize Mosul's heritage and make it accessible to researchers in Iraq and beyond. At the conclusion of the workshop, Alnoor Center presented a documented record containing excavation results and high-resolution archival photographs to the College of Archaeology at the University of Mosul, in appreciation of its pioneering scientific role in supporting field research and in recognition of the importance of inter-university collaboration in preserving Iraq's historical memory. Dr. Nabeel Nour Al-Din affirmed that Alnoor Center is working to build an integrated system for documenting Iraqi heritage through academic research tools and modern technologies, noting that "Mosul represents the heart of this project, with its rich cultural landmarks that deserve to be presented to the world with scientific accuracy and responsibility." This activity comes as part of Alnoor University's program to enhance scientific research in the fields of heritage, archaeology, and cultural preservation, aligning with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) that call for the protection of cultural heritage as an essential part of quality education and international partnerships in service of humanity.
