16 PEACE, JUSTICE AND STRONG INSTITUTIONS



Encouraging the establishment of peaceful communities where no one is marginalized is essential for achieving sustainable development. This involves ensuring that everyone has access to justice, building effective and accountable institutions that are inclusive at all levels, and significantly reducing illicit flows of money and weapons. Additionally, it includes enhancing the recovery and return of stolen assets and combating all forms of organized crime..

In the presence of Professor Dr. Yaseen Taha Al-Hajjar, President of Alnoor University, the university organized a specialized scientific workshop entitled “Deepfake and Digital Security,” held by the University Follow-up Department at the University Presidency in cooperation with the Security Center of Universities and Institutes of Nineveh Governorate. The workshop was delivered by a group of National Security officers from Nineveh, who addressed the major challenges associated with deepfake technologies and their use in media disinformation, electronic blackmail, and identity impersonation, as well as their risks to societal and institutional security. The session also included a practical presentation on methods for detecting digitally manipulated content, ways to enhance digital awareness among students and staff, and preventive measures to protect personal accounts and data from hacking and exploitation. The organizers emphasized the importance of raising digital security awareness on campus, urging caution when dealing with content shared through social media and the necessity of verifying information sources before reposting. This workshop is part of a series of awareness activities organized by the university to strengthen digital security and promote a safe and informed academic environment in light of contemporary technological challenges. At the conclusion of the workshop, the University President awarded certificates of appreciation to the guest speakers, and the event was attended by the President’s assistants for scientific and administrative affairs as well as several college deans.
