The world today is more interconnected than ever before. Improving access to technology and knowledge is a crucial way to exchange ideas and foster innovation. Additionally, coordinating policies to help developing countries manage their debts, as well as encouraging investment in the least developed countries, is vital for achieving growth and sustainable development.

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A delegation from the Iraqi Trainers Syndicate, headed by Dr. Ibrahim Al-Khudairi, President of the Syndicate in Iraq, visited Alnoor University, where they met with Dr. Bashar Mahmoud Ali, Chairman of the University's Board of Directors. During the meeting, discussions were held on expanding avenues of cooperation, as the Syndicate President highlighted the current status of the organization, its fields, and the nature of its work, while also listening to a presentation on the university's academic environment and scientific landscape, paving the way for a future memorandum of cooperation. The delegation was given an introductory tour across the university, including its colleges, departments, facilities, halls, and laboratories. The meeting was attended by the University's Scientific and Media Advisors, the Director of the Continuing Education Center, and the Head of the Syndicate's Nineveh branch.



### College of Arts

Dr. Nadhim Younis Saleh, a faculty member in the Department of Translation at the College of Arts, Alnoor University, participated as a member of a doctoral dissertation defense committee submitted by the student Safaa Manhal Ibrahim to the Department of Translation at the College of Arts, University of Mosul. The dissertation was titled: “Assessing the Translation of English Satirical Posts on Social Media into Arabic: Human Translation Versus Artificial Intelligence Translation.”



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Alnoor University received Mr. Ahmed Shaher Fandi, Director of Bashiqa District, on a field visit aimed at strengthening mutual cooperation and gaining insight into the university's academic environment and its advanced infrastructure. The visit included a tour of several university facilities and colleges, during which the level of scientific and service development was highly praised, along with the efforts made to support the educational process and serve the local community. This visit comes within the framework of Alnoor University's commitment to openness and collaboration with government institutions in a way that contributes to achieving sustainable development and serving the people of Nineveh Governorate.



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As part of its strategic vision for international academic openness, Alnoor University conducted an extensive official tour in the Arab Republic of Egypt, which included visits to Misr University for Science and Technology, Al-Azhar University, and Mansoura University. This tour was carried out within a high-level delegation from the Iraqi Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research, headed by Professor Dr. Haider Abdul Dhahd, Deputy Minister for Scientific Affairs, and included a number of academic figures and university leaders, among them Professor Dr. Hassan Shaker, President of Al-Mustaqbal University, and Professor Dr. Uday Ali Ahmed, Vice President of the British University in Iraq, with the presence of Professor Dr. Thamer Atab Al-Barki, Deputy Iraqi Consul in Cairo. Alnoor University was represented in these meetings by a specialized delegation that included Professor Dr. Ismail Abdulwahab, Assistant President of the University for Scientific Affairs; Professor Dr. Ahmed Mustafa Ali, Dean of the College of Law and Political Science; and Assistant Professor Dr. Mohammed Zuhair Zaidan, Director of Cultural Relations. At the conclusion of the tour, commemorative shields were exchanged with the presidents of the Egyptian universities. Professor Dr. Ismail Abdulwahab stated that these successive visits represent a cornerstone in building effective academic partnerships, affirming Alnoor University's commitment to adopting leading international experiences and employing them to develop its educational and research environment in line with the highest standards.



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As part of Alnoor University's strategy to expand its international partnerships and strengthen engagement with global academic institutions, Dr. Nabil Noor Al-Din Hussein, Director of Alnoor Center for Cultural Heritage Preservation and Assistant Dean of the College of Arts, conducted an official visit to the United Kingdom to explore opportunities for joint scientific and cultural cooperation with several British institutions. The visit began with a meeting with Professor Dr. Qusay Al-Ahmadi, Cultural Attaché at the Iraqi Embassy in London, where discussions focused on enhancing academic exchange, developing cooperation mechanisms with British universities and research centers, and addressing potential challenges to ensure sustainable collaboration. The Cultural Attaché was also briefed on the most prominent activities of Alnoor University in archaeological tourism and cultural heritage preservation, as well as its strategic plans to revive heritage sites in Iraq and transform them into active tourist attractions that support the national economy and sustainable development. These efforts aim to establish joint training and research programs for students and faculty, particularly in Archaeological Tourism and Digital Media, facilitating the transfer of global expertise and its adaptation to the local context. At the end of the meeting, Dr. Nabil Noor Al-Din Hussein presented the Alnoor University shield to Professor Dr. Qusay Al-Ahmadi in appreciation of his role in supporting academic and cultural cooperation and strengthening ties between Iraqi and British educational institutions.



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Alnoor University signed a letter of intent for cooperation with Sarajevo International University. Representing Alnoor University at this event was Professor Dr. Nazim Shakir Al-Wattar, Head of the Department of Physical Education and Sports Sciences, while the partner university was represented by the President of Sarajevo International University. The anticipated academic partnership is expected to include student and faculty exchange programs, the implementation of joint research projects, and the organization of conferences, workshops, and academic activities, all of which will contribute to strengthening international cooperation and the exchange of scientific and cultural expertise between the two sides. It is worth noting that Sarajevo International University is considered one of the distinguished universities in Bosnia and Herzegovina, enjoying a strong international academic presence through its educational programs and partnerships with various universities and academic institutions worldwide.
