Quality Education

Alnoor University held a coordination meeting with the committees responsible for completing the requirements of institutional accreditation and preparing the documents required by the Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research, in preparation for the visit of the National Institutional Accreditation Evaluation Team. The meeting was attended by the Assistant President for Scientific Affairs, Professor Ismail Abdulwahab Ismail, the Head of the Quality Assurance and University Performance Department, and a number of standards coordinators and committee members. The participants reviewed the progress achieved in the institutional accreditation files and discussed mechanisms for completing the evidence and documentation related to the approved standards, in addition to following up on the requirements of the upcoming evaluation visit to ensure a comprehensive presentation of the university's academic and administrative performance, infrastructure, and educational services. The attendees emphasized the importance of strengthening coordination among the university's academic and administrative units and accelerating efforts to complete all requirements within the specified timelines, thereby supporting the university's pursuit of institutional accreditation and reinforcing a culture of quality and continuous improvement in accordance with nationally approved standards.



College of Health and Medical Technologies

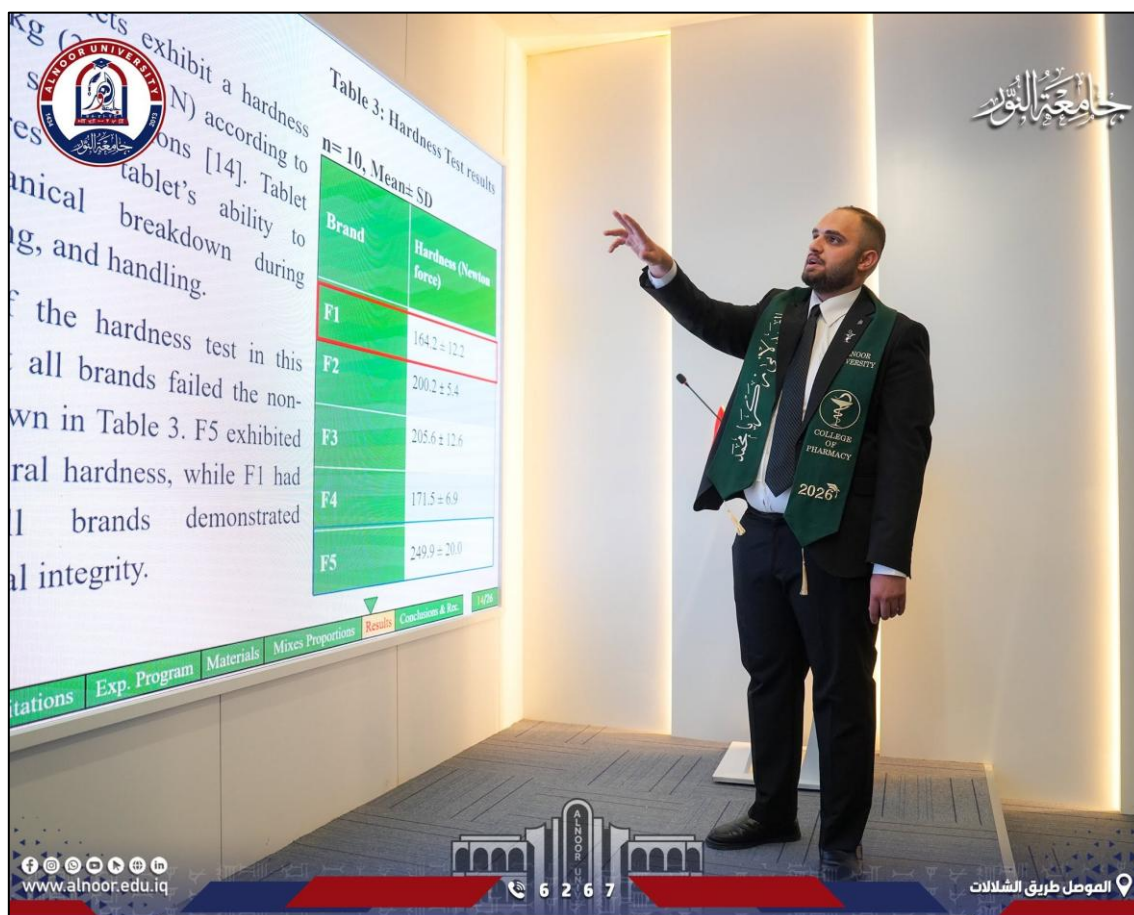

During the discussions, students presented their graduation research projects before scientific committees composed of faculty members from the college, who evaluated the projects and discussed the scientific and practical findings reached by the students, reflecting the level of academic and intellectual preparation provided by the university. Graduation research discussions are among the annual academic activities dedicated to final-year students across the university's colleges and academic departments, serving as an extension of both the theoretical and practical components of the curriculum and contributing to the enhancement of scientific research skills and the integration of academic knowledge with practical application.

College of Pharmacy

Under the patronage of the President of Alnoor University, Professor Dr. Yaseen Taha Al-Hajjar, and the supervision of the Dean of the College of Pharmacy, Assistant Professor Dr. Omar Qutaiba Al-Laila, the College of Pharmacy organized the graduation research discussions for fifth-year students for the 2025–2026 academic year. The event featured the discussion of 44 scientific research projects conducted across six halls and evaluated by six specialized discussion committees, with the participation of professors and examiners from Alnoor University and several Iraqi universities, including the University of Mosul, Nineveh University, the University of Duhok, and Hawler Medical University, reflecting a high level of academic cooperation and scientific exchange among educational institutions. The research projects addressed a wide range of pharmaceutical and clinical topics, with students demonstrating outstanding academic competence in preparing, presenting, and discussing their findings, highlighting the quality of education and academic training provided by the college. The Deanship of the College of Pharmacy expressed its appreciation to the members of the discussion committees and the guest professors from the participating universities for their valuable scientific contributions and wished the students continued success in their academic and professional careers.

College of Pharmacy
