3 GOOD HEALTH AND WELL-BEING



Good health comes with proper nutrition. Without regular and nutritious food, people cannot live, learn, fend off diseases, or lead productive lives. Key goals in this area include: reducing mental health mortality rates; ending neonatal and childhood deaths; combating infectious diseases; preventing and treating drug addiction; and achieving universal health coverage for families.

Alnoor University welcomed the periodic inspection committee from the Nineveh Civil Defense Directorate, headed by Brigadier General Saleh Qasim Saleh and accompanied by several officers from the directorate, as part of the university's commitment to strengthening safety and prevention measures, assessing the readiness of its facilities, and ensuring a safe environment for students and staff. The committee was received by Dr. Ali Latif, Director of the University Administration Affairs Department, who provided an overview of the university's emergency preparedness plans, accident response procedures, and the measures implemented to safeguard students, personnel, and campus facilities. The committee then conducted a comprehensive field inspection of the university's buildings and facilities to evaluate emergency preparedness, inspect civil defense equipment and systems, and assess their distribution and operational readiness. At the conclusion of the visit, the committee commended Alnoor University for its advanced civil defense measures, praising its commitment to safety standards and its continuous efforts to provide a secure and well-prepared campus environment.

College of Arts

The Department of Clinical Psychology at the College of Arts, Alnoor University, announced the launch of the First Aid Psychological Support Volunteer Team and the commencement of the first training course for its members as part of the University's ongoing efforts to promote mental health and serve the community. As the only department in Mosul specializing in Clinical Psychology, the program aims to equip students with the knowledge and practical skills required to provide psychological first aid based on internationally recognized scientific principles and to contribute effectively to humanitarian response during crises and emergencies. The three-month training course is conducted twice a week and offers specialized instruction under the supervision of experienced professionals in mental health and psychological counseling. This initiative reflects Alnoor University's commitment to preparing qualified student volunteers who can promote a culture of psychological support and volunteerism while strengthening community resilience and readiness to respond to diverse humanitarian situations.
